## The Dos

#### Passwords/Backups

- Reset all your passwords and security questions.
- Buy an inexpensive tablet, laptop, etc., if needed due to worry of keystroke software.
- Create new passwords and security questions.
- Create a brand-new email account for all things related to your case.
- Backup all your personal items (pictures, documents, files, etc.) onto a new/ separate drive in case you must give up your phone or joint account.

#### **Property**

- Get copies of titles, deeds, insurance policies, etc.
- Make a list of YOUR separate property with pictures, date purchased, value when purchased and current value.
- Make a list of *JOINT* property with pictures, date purchased, value when purchased and current value.
- Take pictures of each room including the attic, garage, shed, etc. and each wall from the middle with furniture, wall decor, open cabinets & drawers. When gathering pictures in the house turn off any surveillance cameras or wi-fi.
- Get Blue Book value for all cars as of date of separation.
- Get value of all assets as of date of separation. Banking/Bills/Income

- Get a new bank account.
- Change your direct deposits and debts to your new bank account.
- Retrieve statements for all accounts from the month you were married until date of separation (bank, retirement, investment, credit cards, loans, mortgages, etc. accounts.
- Close joint credit accounts.
- Get one year's worth of phone records.
- Place passwords on utilities, phone accounts, etc., so they cannot be turned off without your consent.
- Get copies of past 3 years tax returns or if unavailable get tax transcript.
- Get your own cell phone plan.

#### Important Documents

- Get original copies of birth certificates, vaccine records, social security card, passports, etc. for yourself and children. Give copies to other party.
- Get pictures of prescription medications that you, your spouse and children take, including doctor, pharmacy and date of fill/refill.
- Update Wills and beneficiaries before filing for divorce. (You don't want your soon-to-be-ex making decisions about pulling the plug.)

#### Credit

- Pull a copy of your free credit report from only
  one reporting agency and then check another
  every 4 months. Credit Karma is not the same.
- Remove spouse as an authorized card holder/ user prior to filing your divorce.

#### Communication

- Get a PO Box for your mail.
- Text, email, and communicate like everything is going to be read by the court, because it likely will be.
- If possible, communicate with your spouse only via text message, instant message, or email, so you have a record of your communication.
- Confirm verbal communication with text or email sent.

#### Children

Contact schools and doctors to let them know

- the situation and that no changes in contact should be made.
- Keep a parenting calendar or diary. We recommend a block calendar with one month on each page. Keep notes of who has the child (ren) each day.

#### Additionally

- Document EVERYTHING!
- Keep notes (electronic or on paper) of important events, conversations, dates, and times so you can reference if needed.
- Preserve texts and emails so they do not autodelete. (Suggested apps: iMazing - iPhone, Legal Text Collector - Android)

## The Don'ts

- Do not text your kids anything about the case or their other parent, seriously we do not care if they are 16 or 17, 25 or 40. Don't do it!
- Do not tell friends the nitty-gritty details, friends today may not be friends tomorrow.
   You don't know if they are secretly spying.
- Do not speak ill of your spouse in writing (text, email, social media, etc.) or to mutual friends or family.
- Do not make your spouse's avatar picture and name in your phone derogatory (no poop emojis or names other than their own).
- Do not sign anything without us seeing it first.
- Do not track your spouse or their vehicle, including through your children.

- Do not start dating or move-in with a boyfriend or girlfriend.
- Do not sign-up for dating apps or X-rated websites.
- Do not spend extravagant amounts of money on yourself or anyone else.
- Do not take out loans or transfer money. Do not make major financial changes or choices (i.e. withdrawing retirement funds, buy/sell home, or car, taking out loans, etc.).
- Do not sell or get rid of any joint property or items belonging to spouse.
- Do not destroy property.
- Do not be vindictive when leaving/vacating or a joint residence (put fish inside curtain rods when moving out, etc.).

### Reminders

All records that you keep are discoverable information. Please make sure what you record you are fine with other people seeing in the discovery process.

It is better to have it and not need it, than to need it and not have it.

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
